Sponsorship for Japanese Taiko Drum Program

Huntingdale Primary is a Victorian government school that runs a Japanese Bilingual program in Oakleigh South. Our students experience Japanese language and culture from Foundation to Year 6. We have a total of 380 students and this is expected to increase to around 420 next year.

The school runs many Japanese programs including a Japanese Taiko drumming program. This program has been running since the early 2000's and has 12 students actively learning this instrument as part of the Taiko group, as well as 3 year 5/6 classes who study Taiko as part of our whole school music program. However, the condition and maintenance of our drums is an ongoing issue, so we can keep the current program running using high quality equipment.

We are looking for companies with Japanese connections to sponsor our Taiko Drumming program and we were hoping to arrange sponsorship with you. We are proposing this sponsorship program run until 2025.

Taiko Music Program

A strong part of Japanese culture is the music. Japanese Taiko was introduced to the school to support this program more than 15 years ago and has become an integral part of the school's identity.

Students have the opportunity to learn Taiko as a part of the instrumental music program, with it being the primary focus in years five and six.

In addition the school has a Taiko group made up of children from years four to six, who perform regularly at all major school events as well as regular performances at a wide range of events across Melbourne and is extremely popular. The children rehearse weekly and learn traditional Taiko pieces, increasing in complexity as the children progress.

The Taiko performance group has long been a flagship of excellence for Huntingdale Primary school and act as enthusiastic ambassadors sharing and promoting Japanese culture and language with the wider Melbourne Community. They are also a great source of pride for all at the school.
