- Listen to the request or concern
- Set a timeframe so that you can investigate the request
- Create a communication plan e.g. meeting, diary note, phone call

- Follow up the request or question. You may need to:
 - Investigate an incident
 - Follow up with either your Japanese/English counterpart/yard duty teacher

If the parents are not happy with the outcome or have further questions, repeat steps :

- Listen to their feedback
- Reiterate what you have already done
- Seek further clarification

Communicate the outcome back to the parents within the timeframe and method you agreed on.
