


Acknowledgement of Country

The School's Role

What we do

- Follow DET Guidelines and policies.
- Have a Year 6-7 Transition Coordinator- Maria Mathews + Gill Penfold
- Disseminate Year 6-7 Transition Information to families.
- Let you know of Open Evenings of Secondary Collegessometimes in our newsletter or there are flyers at the Office.
- Pass on to Secondary Colleges your preferences.
- Inform you of what Secondary College your child has been accepted to on the given date specified by DET.
- Fill in transition information about your child, once their Secondary College placement is confirmed.
- Answer your questions and support you.

The School's Role continued...

What we don't do

- ▶ Tell you where to send your child.
- Select your child's Secondary College.
- Make recommendations to any Secondary Colleges about students- either verbally or via letter.
- Write letters for schools.



Your Role

- Discuss Secondary Schooling with your child.
- Find out information about Secondary Colleges e.g.
 Tours, Open Evenings, information packs
- Make a decision on where you want to send your child.
- Ensure you return all notices on time to the school.
- Have a back up plan!
- Understand that we don't have any influence in Secondary College Placements.
- Inform the school immediately if there are any changes to your preferences.

Student Testing & entry interview requirements

- On February 22 DET sent a circular to all schools reminding of this policy
- This change came into effect from Term 2, 2021, introducing changes that apply to all mainstream primary and secondary enrolments.

Schools **must not** undertake student testing before making placement offers.

Schools also must not reserve places or prioritise placement for students because of test results or interviews.

Changes were introduced to:

- Provide greater clarity and transparency for families and to promote equity in the system. The intention is that by only testing students once they have been offered placement, families will have a clearer understanding that test results are not used to prioritise students for enrolment.
- Reduce:
 - the administrative burden on schools
 - the number of students changing schools
 - enrolment appeals.



Choosing a School

There are lots of reasons why parents choose a particular Secondary College for their child:

- Local Neighbourhood School that is within walking distance.
- They are in the zone for that school.
- An older sibling goes there.
- The parents went there themselves- family connection.
- The school has a particular program that appeals e.g. Sport Academy, Arts/Music Program, Japanese
- The academic program the school offers- VCAL, VCE
- The extra-curricular program the school offers- Camps, Leadership Program
- Costs
- Size of school

Don't rely on the 'reputation' of a school from the grapevine... One school that might be good for one child isn't necessarily good for another.....as their needs may be different You need to look for yourself!



Using Find My School Website

- Begin by visiting <u>www.findmyschool.vic.gov.au</u>
- You can find your designated neighbourhood school by entering your residential address OR searching using the name of a school.
- The result will show:
- where the school is located within the zone and the residential address (if provided)
- information about the school, its region and a link to the school website.
- To refine results to the type of school, select 'Primary' or 'Secondary'. There is the option to filter results by year level for secondary schools.



Local School

- The designated neighbourhood school is measured by a straight line from your permanent address, if you live in:
 - Metropolitan Melbourne
 - Ballarat
 - Bendigo
 - Geelong
- If your child lives at multiple addresses, their permanent address is where they spend most of their weekdays.
- Schools may request that parents or carers provide supporting documentation to assist in verifying a student's permanent residential address. There are DET Permanent Address Guidelines
- Your child has a right to enrol in their designated neighbourhood school. This right is set out in the <u>Education Reform Act 2006</u>

DET Placement Policy

Where there are insufficient places at a school for all students who seek entry, students are enrolled in the following priority order:

- 1. Students for whom the school is the designated neighbourhood school.
- 2. Students with a sibling at the same permanent address who are attending the school at the same time.
- 3. Where the regional director has restricted the enrolment, students who reside nearest the school.
- 4. Students seeking enrolment on specific curriculum grounds.
- 5. All other students in order of closeness of their home to the school.

In <u>exceptional circumstances</u>, compassionate grounds. This is made on a case by case basis and is not part of the placement policy. Parents/carers must be able to clearly demonstrate the exceptional circumstances which they believe make an enrolment at the designated neighbourhood school unsuitable for their child (for example, family violence or specific wellbeing, safety, physical health and/or mental health concerns).

Going to a non-local School

- All schools have a zone!
- A number of schools have restricted zones to respond to local population growth.
- Some schools have an enrolment management plan
- You have the choice to enrol your child at a school outside of your designated neighbourhood zone.
- The school may accept this enrolment as long as it has the capacity to do so.
- Once the school has reached is capacity, it cannot accept enrolments from outside its neighbourhood zone. It must reserve enough space to enrol students who move into the zone.
- This is outlined in the placement policy.

Filling in the form

How many secondary schools can I preference on the Application form?

You may list up to three government schools, in your order of preference, in section 4B.

Do I need to identify three secondary school preferences if my first preference is my designated neighbourhood school?

No. It is sufficient to identify one preference if that school is your designated neighbourhood school.

What happens if my child does not receive a place in their preferred secondary school, or schools?

Your child will be allocated to their designated neighbourhood school.

What happens if I change my mind once my child's Year 7 placement has been accepted?

You must contact your child's primary school as soon as possible to advise them of your change of mind. The primary school will liaise with the secondary school(s).

No other forms

- Schools should not ask you to:
 - Fill in other forms
 - Attach any testing results such as NAPLAN
 - Include school reports



Home Schooling

- When you decide to educate your child at home, you take on responsibility for:
 - planning their learning
 - teaching them
 - assessing what they've learnt.
- To apply to register for home schooling you need to submit to the Victorian Registration and Qualifications Authority (VRQA):
 - a completed application form;
 - necessary documentation such as proof of your child's identity;
 - a learning plan detailing how you intend to address the learning areas.

International Students

- ➤ Fee-paying international students are not required to complete this form.
- For enrolment in a public school, make an application online at: www.study.vic.gov.au.
- Contact independent and catholic schools directly for enrolment details.



Non-Government Schools

What should I do if my child will be attending a non-government school for Year 7?

- <u>Confirmed Placement</u>: If you are sure that you already have a place for your child in a non-government secondary school for Year 7, you do not have to complete Section 4 the *Application for Year 7 Placement* form.
- <u>Unconfirmed placement</u>: If you have applied for a place for your child in a non-government secondary school to commence in 2023, but have <u>not</u> had this placement confirmed, or the VRQA is still <u>assessing</u> your child's registration application for home schooling, you may also apply for a place in a government school by completing section 4B.
- Late confirmation of placement: If your child is granted a Year 7 place in a nongovernment secondary school, or your child's registration for home schooling is approved by the VRQA, <u>after</u> you have been allocated a place in a government school, you should notify your child's primary school immediately.



Some Important Advice

- If you don't return the Year 6-7 Transition forms your child will be allocated to their designated local school.
- If you don't receive a place in your preferred school your child will be placed in their designated local school.
- If your circumstances and Secondary College preferences change please tell the school immediatelywe will pass this information onto the relevant Secondary Colleges.

Appeals

How do I make an appeal about my child's Year 7 placement for 2023?

- In the first instance, parents/carers should lodge a written appeal with the <u>preferred</u> <u>secondary school</u>. This is the school at which your child has been unsuccessful in gaining a Year 7 placement.
- Your appeal may be lodged using the Year 6 to Year 7 Transition Placement Appeal form. We will provide you with a copy of this form.
- This written appeal should be lodged with the <u>preferred</u> secondary school, by Friday 29 July 2022.
- It will be considered by the school's placement committee and/or Principal and you will receive written notification of the outcome by Tuesday 9 August
